By 2050, one out of five people in these regions will be over 65 years old



Currently 14.6% of population in Latin America is 60+ (100 million +-)



By 2025 this population will represent 18% (127 million +-)



By 2030 there will be more adults over 60 than children under 15, and this will occur 20 years earliest in Latin America than the rest of the world.

Concept of "Age friendly cities and communities" in Latin America. What is an "Age friendly city" proposed by the World Health Organization:

In an age-friendly community, the policies, services and structures related to the physical and social environment are designed to help seniors "age actively." In other words, the community is set up to help seniors live safely, enjoy good health and stay involved. America continent is the fastest growing region for Age friendly Cities, with a total of 758, divided as follows:

- Chile 190
- Brazil 18
- Argentina 17
- Costa Rica 14
- Mexico 33
- Canada 99

1. Ensure that communities foster the abilities of older people.

2. Provide access to longterm care for older people in need.
